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Description

Polar Caves Park is home to one of the **America's** most sensational glacial cave formations. Polar Caves is in the White Mountain region of New Hampshire; only minutes away from the Lakes Region. Guest can explore 9 glacial caves, lose themselves in the Rock Garden Boulder Maze, hike the peaceful nature trails, enjoy the scenic vista overlooking the Baker River Valley, or picnic in our pine woods.

Park Highlights

Our park features magnificent glacial caves formed 50,000 years ago when the ice sheet melted and deposited massive granite blocks forming a series of caves and passageways perfect for exploring (No crawling involved).

The Polar Sluice and Klondike Mine are fun ways to relive mining history. Buy a bag of Mining



Rough and head to the sluice where you clean away the dirt to reveal your gems and minerals or let the kids explore and find gemstones in the Klondike Mine.

One of our most interesting features is our deer and bird exhibits allowing hands on feeding of our fallow deer, discover birds from around the world or share a treat with our large family of ducks.

Our Sugarhouse and Museum are filled with maple sugaring artifacts from years gone by. The sugarhouse features many maple products and other treats to tempt your sweet tooth.

Polar Caves Park is nestled in woodland settings, after exploring

the caves, enjoy a walk on our nature trails set in our tranquil forest or cool off under pine trees and enjoy a family picnic. Our main gift shop provides shopping for local and far away treasures for your pleasure, as well as, limited food and beverage options.



Hours and Dates of Operation

Polar Cave's season is weather dependant, opening the second weekend in May through mid October, please call for updated information. The Caves are open for 9am to 5pm during the summer and 10am to 4:30pm in the fall.

Group policies

Reservations are required for all groups. Group rates are based on 15 or more people and we offer one free admission for every 15 people. Payment is due upon arrival unless other arrangement have been made.

Free Group Option

Many tour groups visit the Baker River Valley for the scenic vistas and covered bridges, we recognize that many of these tours can not handle the stairs required to tour our caves.

However, for these groups we offer a **FREE** option, with a reservation, groups are welcome to visit us and explore our gift shop, see our animal park, try the Polar Sluice, or grab a cup of coffee and lunch. This is also a wonderful option if only a few in your tour group are interested in exploring the caves.

Directions

From Interstate 93 take Exit 26 onto Tenney Mountain Highway (rte 25) continue on for about 4 miles; go straight through a traffic circle; Polar Caves is approximately mile ahead.

From Interstate 91 take Vermont exit 15, Bradford, VT. Turn right heading for Bradford. At the four-way light, go straight. You will quickly cross the Conn. River into New Hampshire follow Rte 25a for approximately 15 miles; where it merges with Rte. 25. Continue for 10 miles and turn right into the Polar Caves.
